And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil"

Without another word Jesus immediately took the disciples with Him into the city.

This was the shortest lesson ever given upon the greatest subject ever taught.

But this prayer, which took so short a time to recite, is deserving of a lifetime of study.

That is what Jesus expected his disciples to give it.

Jesus used this prayer over and over as a means of communion with God, not a recitation to God.

The prayer is a frame or scaffolding upon which to lift our thoughts up to God.

The framework is true, the lines are plumb, the workmanship is flawless.

Jesus was a carpenter. In the scriptures, he referred to His trade in these words:

"Come unto me, all who are weary and heavy laden...for My yoke is easy and my burden is light."

We think of Jesus as one who constructed ox yokes noted for their comfort and ease for the toiling animal.

In the same way, His construction of the frame of prayer for toiling,

heavy-laden humanity is flawless throughout.
